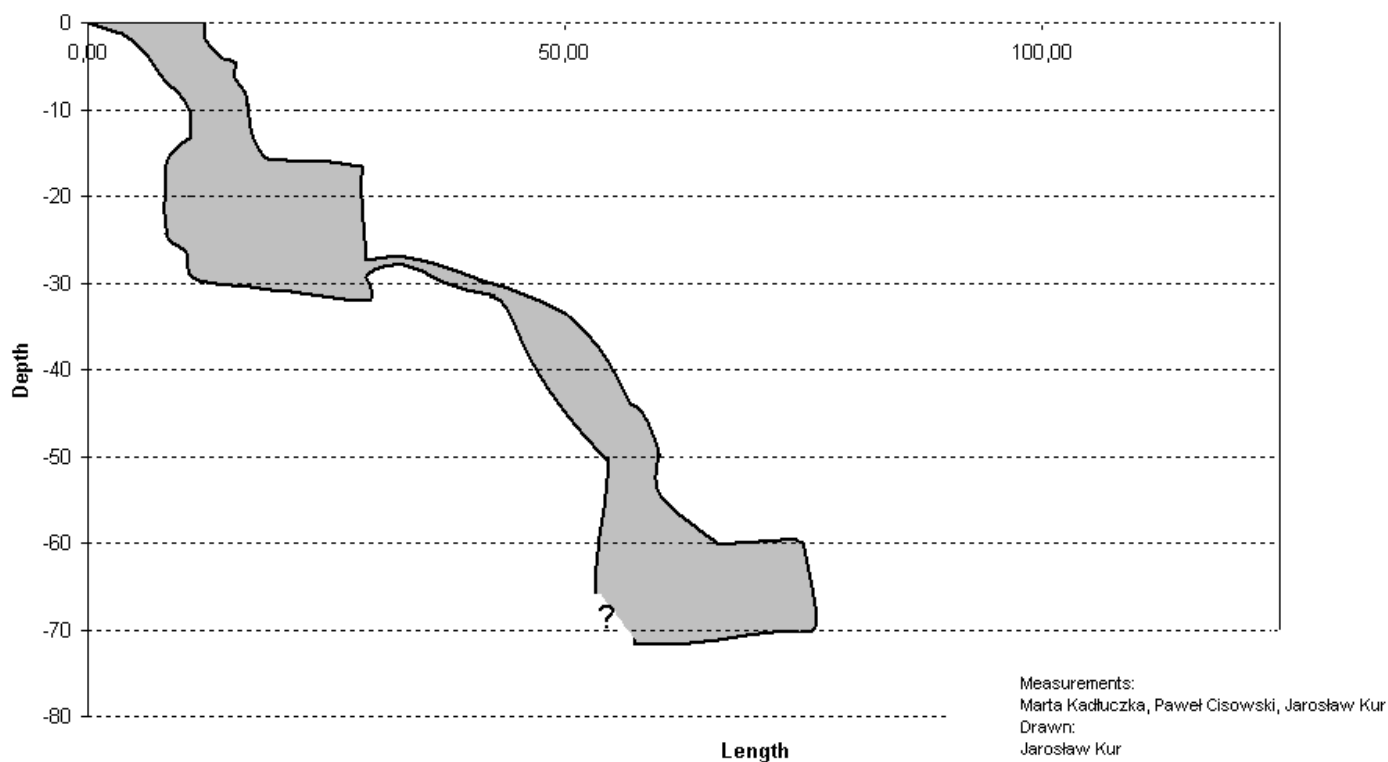


Diving Report 04-08.02.2008 Žagubica, Serbia

Vrelo Mlave cave

The first passage of the cave is situated in a lake. The depth of the lake is 32 meters. Visibility is poor by the surface but gets better closer to the bottom of the lake. At the bottom there is a canyon and a stone-ravine. The dive was difficult and dangerous due to a strong current that gets even stronger when the weather is rainy. Also loose guide-lines cause that diving the cave is hazardous as it is far too easy to get entangled in one. Our few attempts to enter the cave failed because of the strength of the current. The last dive was 70 meters. At this depth there is a huge hall with a sand slope at the bottom. All dives were trimix dives and ratio deco 1:2 method was used for decompression.

The record dive in this cave was performed by a Serbian diver Uros Aksamovic. He dived 72 meters. The cave has not been explored yet.
